I am a graduate of Columbia College (A.B. '61), Columbia Engineering School (B.S.E.E. '62), and Columbia Law School (LL.B. '65). I am a graduate of New York University Law School (LL.M. '66), where I was a graduate fellow in the Arthur Garfield Hays Civil Liberties Program.

I am the author of a law school textbook on prisoners' rights (*Prisoners' Rights – Treatment of Prisoners and Post-Conviction Remedies*, Mathew Bender 1976). I am also the author of a number of articles on criminal justice subjects, including the investigation and prosecution of Medicaid fraud.
